Important information for parent/carer following a vaccination

Possible side effects of the nasal flu vaccine.

The nasal spray flu vaccine has very few side effects, the main one being that post vaccine children may have a slightly runny nose for a short time.

- Other possible Side Effects include:
- Fever and muscle ache
- Headache
- Feeling slightly unwell
- Reduced appetite
- Tiredness

This card tells you about the common side effects that may occur following immunisations in young people.

Common Side Effects:

- Swelling/small hard lump at the site of injection
- Redness
- Tenderness
- Fever
- Muscle ache
- Tiredness

Headache

- Feeling sick
- Swollen glands
