# **Snow/Bad Weather Warnings**

If school will not be opening due to a heavy fall of snow or in fact closed for any reason, we will issue a text message. Sometimes it is possible to open the school later than usual to allow us to secure the site and make it as safe as possible, and again we would use our text messaging service to notify you of this.

In some instances, when conditions worsen during the school day, please take the initiative to collect your child as soon as possible. **There is no necessity to telephone, just come**. We would, of course, remain in school until the last child has been collected. It would be inappropriate for children to be left in Crèche under such circumstances and all after-school activities would likewise be cancelled.

If conditions are extremely icy, please do not take any undue risk to yourselves (or your cars!). In such circumstances we will understand if your child is later than usual getting to school, or you decide not to risk the journey at all. Much better to be safe than sorry, for you and especially your children, are very precious. Please contact school via email to let us know if your child will not be in so that we can update our registers.

## **Rewards & Sanctions Initiative**

All children from F2 - UVI have yearly sticker cards and can collect special stickers from any adult in school. There is a 'treat' every term for any child achieving ten stickers. Sticker totals are recorded each week by class teachers on files within the school network and overseen by the rewards and sanctions co-ordinator.
