Our Forest School programme is now half way through its second year and we are going from strength to strength. Everyone involved is benefiting from regular sessions in our lovely 'outdoor classroom' in the woods and the children are growing in confidence and gaining valuable experiences which will benefit them for life. Thank you to everyone who has supported our Forest School venture, we value your commitment and appreciate your feedback.

We would just like to remind you that the correct kit is absolutely essential, especially at this time of year! Many children are still not coming properly dressed for sessions in the cold and this can be stressful for all staff and children. Having to check each child's clothing, then find spare clothing and wait while they put it on can delay sessions by up to an hour. This disadvantages all the children. If a child becomes

very cold during a session due to inappropriate clothing it means we have to change what we have planned. Consequently we have then focus on one child for a significant amount of time, again disadvantaging all the children and jeopardising the entire session. If we can't warm a child up the situation could become potentially serious.

Please see below and ensure your child/children have the correct kit for their next session. If you have any queries or are unsure of any item of clothing, please don't hesitate to catch either myself or Mrs Cardus and we would be happy to help or advise you.

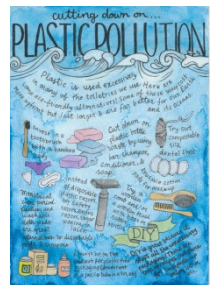
School Council Poster Competition

Snow/Bad Weather Warnings

1. If school will not be opening due to a heavy fall of snow or in fact closed for any reason, we will issue a text message. Sometimes it is possible to open the school later than usual to allow us to secure the site and make it as safe as possible, and again we would use our text messaging service to notify you of this.
2. In some instances, when conditions worsen during the school day, please take the initiative to collect your child as soon as possible. **There is no necessity to telephone, just come.** We would, of course, remain in school until the last child has been collected. It would be inappropriate for children to be left in Crèche under such circumstances and all after-school activities would likewise be cancelled.
3. If conditions are extremely icy, please do not take any undue risk to yourselves (or your cars!). In such circumstances we will understand if your child is later than usual getting to school, or you decide not to risk the journey at all. Much better to be safe than sorry, for you and especially your children, are very precious, again there is no need to telephone the school.

Last year the children said.....

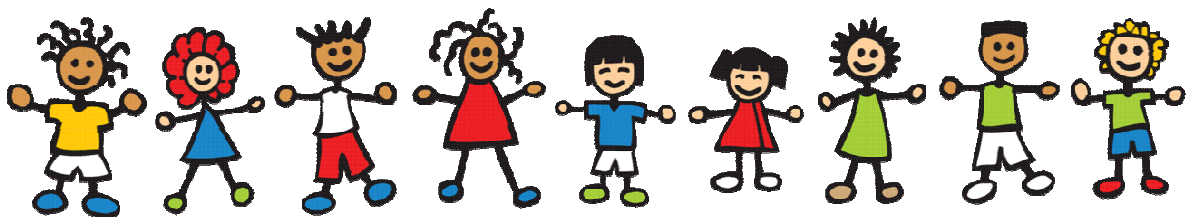

My name is Nick Hindle and I am a former pupil of Lady Lane Park School. I continued my education at Woodhouse Grove School and then obtained my Sports Coaching BA (Hons) degree at University of Central Lancashire. Since then, I have been working for various organisations including 4 months in a child care centre in Perth, Australia. I currently work for Bronte House School in the PE Department and I am also Head Coach for the Ryan Sidebottom Cricket Academy.

Last summer, Mrs Earl invited me to help her during one of her holiday clubs; subsequently I ran my own sports camp following this. My ethos is primarily to encourage children to step away from 'screens' and to get as much fresh air and exercise as possible, whilst learning new skills in the process. Ultimately, this is the children's holiday and I want them to have fun! I run a 'relaxed, easy going' club with great emphasis on safety, kindness and fair play towards each other.

I will be running a Holiday Club this summer at Lady Lane Park School, based at the Lodge. Miss Holmes and Mr Rawling will also be joining me. I welcome any parents who wish to contact me either by email (nickhindle@live.co.uk) or by mobile (07972-841012) to discuss any aspects of the holiday club.

Activities proposed:

Sports: eg. cricket, football, tag rugby, tennis, badminton and every child's favourite DODGEBALL!

Arts and Crafts: eg. painting, drawing, colouring, painting stones, making jewellery etc.

Creative Play: den building using boxes and sheets, water play, creating scenes with plastic animals and wooden bricks etc.

Old fashioned Games: Hoopla, egg and spoon race, hopscotch etc.

Indoor Activities (in case of rain): we have plenty of board games including bagatelle (a firm favourite), arts and crafts activities, 'chilling time' with a movie ONLY when children are tired, full size table football and much more.

Children's Choice

Children will be allowed at certain times during the day to choose their own activities, so for example if they don't want to make jewellery, they can build a den. I will have many alternatives for the children to choose from at this time.

My Holiday Club is 'nut-free' and 'screen-free'. I want the children to step 'back in time' and properly learn how to interact and play and create, without an Ipad or Gameboy in sight!

I will be at the Holiday Club in June with Mrs Earl and her team if you would like to meet me or if you have any questions.
